SPECIFIC COMPLAINT(S):

Issue: The SDP failed to provide transportation as a related service as required by the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) to those students whose Individualized Education Programs (IEP) or Chapter 15 504 Service Plan Agreements require transportation.

APPLICABLE REGULATORY AUTHORITY:

IDEA - §300.34 Related services.

- (a) General. Related services means transportation and such developmental, corrective, and other supportive services as are required to assist a child with a disability to benefit from special education, and includes speech language pathology and audiology services, interpreting services, psychological services, physical and occupational therapy, recreation, including therapeutic recreation, early identification and assessment of disabilities in children, counseling services, including rehabilitation counseling, orientation and mobility services, and medical services for diagnostic or evaluation purposes. Related services also include school health services and school nurse services, social work services in schools, and parent counseling and training.
- (c) Individual related services terms defined. The terms used in this definition are defined as follows:
- (16) Transportation includes—
- (i) Travel to and from school and between schools;
- (ii) Travel in and around school buildings; and
- (iii) Specialized equipment (such as special or adapted buses, lifts, and ramps), if required to provide special transportation for a child with a disability.

22 Pa Code §14.131. IEP. (a) (6)

(a) In addition to the requirements incorporated by reference (see 34 CFR 300.320—300.324),

(6) The IEP of each student shall be implemented as soon as possible, but no later than 10 school days after its completion.

FINDINGS:

1. The Adviser sent out a Transportation Survey to the principals of each school in the SDP and to every school outside of the District where a SDP student is assigned. The survey requested information about bus or cab route numbers, the transportation company providing the transportation, and whether or not there was a transportation issue on any of the routes to their school and if so, a description of the transportation issue.

- 2. The survey was sent to 254 schools. Thirty-seven percent or 93 of the surveys were returned resulting in the following:
 - Twenty-six schools reported no transportation issues during the 2014-15 school year.
 - Fifty schools reported transportation issues, but they did not result in compensatory education.
 - Seventeen schools reported transportation issues which resulted in compensatory education.

FOR THOSE SCHOOLS THAT FAILED TO RESPOND TO THE SURVEY CONDUCTED DURING THE ORIGINAL CIR INVESTIGATION, THE BSE WILL CONDUCT A TARGETED MONITORING OF THEIR TRANSPORTATION SERVICES FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES. THE MONITORING WILL TAKE PLACE DURING THE 2015-16 SCHOOL YEAR AND WILL INCLUDE A REVIEW OF AT LEAST 50 STUDENT FILES, AS WELL AS INTERVIEWS WITH PARENTS, PRINCIPALS, DRIVERS, AND BUS ATTENDANTS. THE TARGETED MONITORING WILL ADDRESS THE FOLLOWING ISSUES:

- DETERMINE WHETHER OR NOT TRANSPORTATION, AS A RELATED SERVICE, IS DISCUSSED AT IEP MEETINGS.
- PARENT AWARENESS OF WHO TO CONTACT WHEN THERE IS A TRANSPORTATION CONCERN.
- TRAINING NEEDS OF TRANSPORTATION PROVIDERS, INCLUDING DRIVERS AND ATTENDANTS.
- 3. The following are transportation issues that were identified in the surveys:
 - · No attendants on the bus.
 - Inconsistent attendant on the bus.
 - No harnesses available for specific students.
 - Parents didn't get called back when they placed calls to the transportation department to inform them of a problem.
 - Students have been removed from the bus and required to walk home.
 - Buses arrive late in the morning.
 - Buses arrive late at the end of the school day.
 - Delays on assigning 1:1 bus assistants to students.
 - No car seats for specific students.
 - No air conditioning on certain buses.
 - · No heat on certain buses.
 - Drivers' family members show up in the cabs that take students to and from school.
 - Delays in receiving copies of bus videos when requested.
 - Sometimes bus videos are not available at all.
 - Drivers make unscheduled stops.
 - Fighting on buses between students.
 - Drivers and assistants antagonize students.
 - Assistants use cell phone while on the bus with Students.
- 4. Bus attendants are assigned to support the bus driver in managing all of the students on a particular bus. 1:1 bus assistants are assigned to support individual students on the bus as required by the student's IEP.

- 5. The Executive Director reported that transportation trainings were provided to bus attendants and bus drivers. Bus attendants attended professional development meetings on May 19, 2015, and June 19, 2015. Bus Drivers attended professional development meetings on June 22, 2015.
- 6. The Professional Development Agenda indicates that the meetings covered the following topics:
 - Rules and guidelines for picking up and dropping students off on time.
 - Common disability characteristics.
 - Potential behaviors and ways to deescalate these behaviors.
 - The importance of structure.
 - How to recognize and respond to bullying.
- 7. The SDP did not provide any information regarding the District's procedures for responding to parent phone calls in regards to transportation issues.
- 8. The following buses/cabs were late to school in the morning, resulting in a denial of a Free and Appropriate Public Education (FAPE), on the indicated dates:

CONCLUSION:

The SDP is out of compliance with the regulation cited above. The SDP did not provide transportation as a related service, as required on students' IEPs or 504 plans. Specifically, the SDP did not provide

transportation on a timely schedule during the 2014-15 school year. All special education students who are assigned to the bus routes listed in the findings are eligible for compensatory education to remedy the educational loss when they did not receive a FAPE due to the lateness of their bus in the morning.

CLOSURE/CORRECTIVE ACTION:

A. The Superintendent or his designee will convene a meeting with the parents of each special education student who is assigned to the bus or cab routes indicated in the findings above. The purpose of this meeting is to develop a plan for compensatory education as a remedy to the educational loss, and to issue a Notice of Recommended Educational Placement/Prior Written Notice (NOREP/PWN) to each parent to approve or disapprove of the compensatory education agreement.

Should the parent and SDP be unable to come to an agreement, the District will submit a written request for assistance from the Bureau of Special Education by September 30, 2015, to include a list of the proposals for compensatory education from each party, and signed by both parties. This request is to be sent to: Maria Mardula, Chief, Division of Monitoring and Improvement - East, Bureau of Special Education, 333 Market Street, 7th Floor, Harrisburg, PA 17126-0333, Fax (717) 783-6139.

If one or both parties do not agree with the Bureau of Special Education's compensatory education plan, the matter is subject to the available remedies to resolve any disagreement, including mediation or a due process hearing, on the same issues addressed in the complaint.

- B. The Superintendent or his designee is ordered to:
 - Develop a system for responding to parents' transportation concerns and issues.
 - Issue a memorandum/e-mail to all relevant staff, regarding the SDP's policies and procedures for responding to parents' transportation concerns.
- C. PENDING REVIEW OF THE RESULTS OF THE TRANSPORTATION TARGETED MONITORING, THE BSE WILL MAKE A DETERMINATION AS TO WHETHER FURTHER CORRECTIVE ACTION WILL BE REQUIRED BY THE SDP IN THE FOLLOWING AREAS: ADDRESSING TRANSPORTATION AT IEP MEETINGS, RESPONDING TO PARENTS' TRANSPORTATION CONCERNS, PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT FOR TRANSPORTATION PROVIDERS, AND THE PROVISION OF COMPENSATORY EDUCATION FOR FAILURE TO PROVIDE FAPE DUE TO TRANSPORTATION ISSUES.

VERIFICATION OF COMPLETION OF CORRECTIVE ACTION:

A. The Superintendent or his designee will forward a copy of the plan for compensatory education and a copy of the Compensatory Education NOREP/PWN, which has been issued to the parent of each student who was assigned to the bus or cab routes indicated in the findings above during the 2014-15 school year to this Special Education Adviser at: Pennsylvania Department of Education, Bureau of Special Education, 333 Market Street, 7th Floor, Harrisburg, PA 17126-0333, on or before **September 30, 2015**. The SDP may use the attached compensatory education plan agreement format for the corrective action.

B. The Superintendent or his designee will forward:

- A written report of the SDP's system for responding to parents' transportation concerns and issues.
- A copy of the memorandum/e-mail regarding the system for responding to parents' transportation concerns.

NOTICE: In accordance with federal regulations, this report constitutes the Pennsylvania Department of Education's final decision with regard to this complaint.

If either party disagrees with the conclusions in the complaint investigation report (CIR), the party has the right to submit a written request for reconsideration with additional information either not considered or not available at the time of the investigation. The written request for reconsideration must be submitted within ten (10) calendar days of the date of the CIR. The Bureau of Special Education will determine if the additional information is sufficient to warrant a review of the conclusions reached as a result of the investigation. Upon determining the sufficiency of the information, the Bureau of Special Education will notify the parties in writing of its decision to reconsider the conclusions reached. The Bureau of Special Education will issue its decision on the request for reconsideration within 30 calendar days from Bureau of Special Education's receipt of the request.

A local educational agency must implement any corrective actions ordered in the CIR without waiting for the Bureau of Special Education's decision on the request for reconsideration.
